Amnion Chorion Allograft: A Protein Enriched in Membrane for use in Guided Tissue Regeneration and Site Preservation

Placental allograft membranes are new to the field of dentistry. They possess several unique features not available with xenograft collagen membranes including composed of immunologically privileged tissue, have anti-inflammatory effect, antibacterial properties, and possess high concentrations of laminin and laminin-5, two cellular adhesion proteins shown to be integral for gingival epithelial cell migration/adhesion.

Early iterations of placental allograft products were only composed of amnion. Recently, a new

membrane composed of amnion and chorion was introduced for use as barrier membrane.

The presentation will review the background scientific properties of placental allografts, review immunohistochemistry analysis of amnion chorion membrane (BioXclude™, Snoasis Medical) and its application in the treatment of periodontal defects with guided tissue regeneration, guided bone regeneration, and site preservation following tooth extraction.

Attendees will learn:

- 1) the scientific merits of placental allograft tissue as a basis for regenerative products,
- 2) indications where the use of amnion chorion membrane should be considered,
- 3) learn why the novel biologic and physical properties of amnion chorion membrane reduces the complexity with using barrier membranes, and
- 4) the unique clinical benefits they provide to the patient and clinician.

He is a diplomate of both the American Board of Periodontology and the

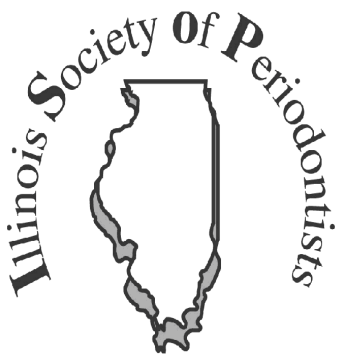
International Congress of Oral Implantologists.
